Evangelium Vitae 25 Years Later



Dear Friends,

If all has gone well, then I am in New Zealand visiting my nephew who lives and works there. Fr. Boes is traveling with me and we will be hiking around to see the sights of this beautiful part of the world. I know that others have canceled their travels because of the coronavirus, but we are going forward because it seems like New Zealand will be okay if we stay in the great outdoors.

It is clear now that the coronavirus will spread throughout the world. That includes us sinners here in Omaha. The Archdiocese has already discussed protocol if it should happen to arrive in Omaha on a wider scale than what is happening at UNMC.

A few thoughts in general:

First: As Christians, we should not panic. We understand that someday we will die. This virus is unlikely to be the cause of that. We must pray for those who are suffering. We must pray for our civil leaders. We must pray that the Lord grant us peace even in unpeaceful times. God will not leave us during trying times; in fact, God will be closer to us than ever.

Second: Follow the advice of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC).

Third: Wash your hands, cover your cough, seek medical help if you are sick and stay away from others if you are sick. Practice good hygiene and care for others. As the Archdiocese has told us, "Priests, deacons, and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are urged to practice good hygiene, washing their hands before Mass begins or even using an alcohol based anti-bacterial solution before and after distributing Holy Communion. If parishioners are sick or are experiencing symptoms of sickness they are not obliged to attend Mass, and even out of charity ought not to attend."

Fourth: A quarantine in Omaha is unlikely. There have been quarantines in other parts of the world when the virus emerged. This is not a cause for panic, but rather a cause for preparation. It would be prudent to have adequate food and medicines on hand for 30 days (the quarantine for this virus has generally been 14 days) just in case. Stock up on non-perishable food items and medicines that you need.

Fifth: Will we cancel Masses? The Archbishop will make that decision if the virus appears in Omaha and is recommended by health officials. Will there be other things that effect how we celebrate Mass during this time? There might be, but we will get the Archbishop's blessing before we do anything.

Please do not panic. Pray. Ask the Lord to give us all what is best for our salvation. These health crises have happened before. Even in this, there is the opportunity for spiritual growth and we should take advantage of opportunities to serve and to care for others.

Please, if you need ANYTHING and you cannot get someone to help you call us. Churches have always served the people during such things as wars, famines, plagues, and outbreaks — God willing we will do the same.
