

Dear Friends,



The image of being a people on the way has been with the Church from the very beginning. Jesus' initial call to each disciple is to follow. While the metaphor of being on the way describes physical movement, for most of us the journey is a spiritual one that takes us into a deeper friendship with God.

It is that image of being followers on the way that shapes our Annual Report this year. It is filled with stories that celebrate the journey we are on as a parish and the journey each of us are on as we seek to be disciples of Jesus. While we walk with Jesus in our ordinary lives, Jesus continues to show up, intertwining our individual journeys with the journey of the church community.

We often sing the song All Are Welcome at our Sunday Liturgies. Those are not just words in a song. We really mean it, all are welcome here. Whether you are a person of deep prayer and have a long relationship with Jesus or you've just met Jesus for the very first time, you belong at Cabrini. If you give many hours of service each week or barely have time to pray, you belong at Cabrini. Perhaps for many families, life itself is a burden. Your days may be filled with what seem like ordinary tasks, striving to be good while doing what's necessary to survive in a hard world: working a tiring job, feeding kids, getting enough sleep, paying bills, avoiding excessive debt, occasionally seeing friends, fixing household or familial problems, maybe taking a vacation. Into this life, we add the challenge of growing as a disciple. So, you go to church, share in the sacraments, say your prayers, raise your kids in the faith, and generally try to fulfill the duties and roles to which you understand God has called you. Jesus walks with you in those ordinary tasks and you belong at Cabrini. We all belong here because we need God and we need each other.

Following Jesus, while inviting us to live and love like Jesus does, is meant to be a joy and not a burden. All that Jesus did for us and does for us is pure gift. And, as we reflect on the Eucharist this year, we remember that this too is pure gift, grace upon grace. That's what the Church says a sacrament is, the material sign and instrument of God's grace, not one we earn but simply receive. God willing, the Spirit so moves in the regular, daily and weekly, reception of Holy Communion that believers are drawn into a lifelong journey of sanctification, being transformed into that which pleases the Lord. What that looks like is up to God, and it begins, it does not end, with initiation into and partaking of the liturgical and sacramental life of God's people.

You will be hearing more about a "clear path" of discipleship in the upcoming year. The goal being to offer you, wherever you are on your walk with Jesus, a helping hand and guide. Cabrini is here to walk with you. We walk together – with Jesus. Enjoy this year's report as we celebrate the God who walks with us.





ALL SAINTS SCHOOL

All Saints School is a major ministry at St. Frances Cabrini. The parish provides financial support to the school through the Spaghetti Dinner, offered twice a year, with all proceeds from the dinner benefiting the school. Parishioners also support All Saints School by volunteering in classrooms, helping with reading and in the athletic programs.

While the school was once supported by a group of neighboring parishes, it is now operated through CUES which stands for Christian Urban Education Services. The CUES Board has been providing the major provisions, leadership and governance of All Saints School since 2013. CUES also operate Sacred Heart and Holy Name Grade Schools.

Our parish roots are steeped in the dreams and desires of immigrant families. All Saints continues that tradition. The students come from a variety of cultural backgrounds. Almost 75% of the students are children of immigrant families.

Completely Kids provides before and after school programing for the students in All Saints School. Support for this program comes from the entire metro Omaha area.

We are very grateful for all who help support All Saints School, CUES and Completely Kids. They make a huge difference in the lives of these young students.

"I want you to be leaders also in the spirit of cheerful giving...this is one way to prove that your love is real, that it goes beyond mere words." 2 Corinthians 8:7-8

Our financial gift to the work of God on earth reveals our spiritual maturity:

"Where your treasure is, there your heart is also." Matthew 6:21

"Give and it will be given back to you...for the measure with which you measure, will be measured back to you."

"There is more happiness in giving than receiving." Acts of the Apostles 20:35

The Catholic Church teaches that the 10% return to the Lord should be divided up in the following manner: 5% supports our local parish, 1% supports the diocese and 4% supports all other charities.

To arrive at the 5% amount in a simple formula is to give, each Sunday, one dollar for every thousand you make a year. For example, if you make \$20,000 a year, then you would give \$20 each Sunday. If you make \$75,000 a year, then you would give \$75 each Sunday.

The following pages offer a summary of the financial position of the parish for the fiscal year which began July 1, 2022, and concluded June 30, 2023. If you wish to see a detailed breakdown of income and expenses, that is available in the Parish Office by contacting Jan Bode, Business Manager. We practice financial transparency as much as possible in the parish. The parish's financial books are open, no financial secrets are kept from parishioners.

Looking at the numbers, you will notice that not much has changed from last year to this year. The parish is holding some substantial financial reserves as we work to put together sufficient funds to proceed with remodeling the old swimming pool area in the Cabrini Parish Center into a social hall. Parish leadership decided in May to start individually approaching parishioners about contributing to a campaign for the work to be done on the social hall. Like so much of our present economic world, projected costs for the work on the new hall continue to increase. Estimates are now at over a million dollars to construct restrooms, a catering kitchen and the social hall itself.

Sunday collections increased this past year over the prior year thanks to the generosity of many parishioners. The average annual gift to the parish is about \$1,500. Cabrini encourages parishioners to follow the biblical tradition of tithing. The 10% tithe can be broken down into 5% for the local parish, 1% to the wider church and 4% to other charities. Those who are quick with their math will realize that a \$1,500 gift is coming from somebody who makes \$30,000 a year (that would be a 5% tithe). When everyone is tithing, the parish has plenty of support to carryout the work of the gospel in our midst.

Parish leadership remains committed to providing Masses and other parish activities online. There are ongoing costs involved in providing access online, but we feel the benefits outweigh the costs. Our Sunday Masses are watched by people all around the country (not huge numbers, but widely viewed). Much of what has been offered in the past (Masses, Bible Studies, Cabrini Fireside Chats, etc.) is still available online at the parish's website and its YouTube Channel. In addition, many of you are sharing in the Cabrini Community's videos which are produced locally. These too continue to bear much fruit.

The parish keeps a close eye on spending but, like your own household, does not have control over escalating energy and insurance costs. The Archdiocesan assessment costs also continue to increase. Your support is appreciated in meeting these climbing costs.




