Dear Damian,

We want to express our gratitude for the generosity shown by each of you and by all of the members of St. Frances Cabrini parish to the residents of Omaha Welcomes the Stranger, Inc. The large supply of laundry soap, paper goods, personal care items, hygiene products and food delivered by you and your volunteers throughout the month of December has been eagerly received by the guests of OWS, and will last them for many months ahead.

Recently migrant families have arrived in Omaha who have no sponsors here or elsewhere in the U.S. OWS is currently supporting ten families in our shelter as well as nine families who have recently moved from the shelter to rental housing. Most of the adults have work permits and are employed full-time in factory work, landscaping, building maintenance, janitorial work, child care and education. The children are all in school.

Our dedicated volunteers help the migrant guests in many ways:

- assisting with school enrollment for children
- transportation to medical, dental, legal appointments and food pantries
- grocery shopping/clothing shopping
- obtaining work permits
- facilitating and teaching English classes
- providing a source of encouragement and emotional support

The gifts of the St. Frances Cabrini parishioners help defray the expenses of OWS in this effort, and supply these families not only with material assistance but also a warm welcome to our country. Your generous spirit is a sign of hope in challenging times!
